

OFFICIAL RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE LUCKY DUCKY DERBY RUBBER DUCK RACE

Organized by The Tennessee Valley Art Association (“organizer”) a 501(c)(3) organization (tax-exempt charity) Tax I.D. #23-7110116.

1. Rubber or plastic ducks will be launched into Spring Creek at Spring Park in Tuscumbia at approximately 3:00 p.m. on Sunday, June 29, 2008. The race course will be established by the Organizer.
2. All ducks entered will be provided by the Organizer and shall remain the property of the Organizer.
3. Once the ducks are launched, they are on their own. No attempt to free or interfere with any duck is permitted, unless deemed necessary by the Organizer. The racecourse will close 20 minutes after the final place duck has crossed the finish line and/or gathered in the duck trap. Any ducks finishing after that time will not be eligible for prizes.
4. A number will be attached to the bottom of each duck relating to the number on an adoption certificate. Multiple duck entries from one certificate will be assigned additional, individual duck numbers for identification. A physical barrier (or trap) will be deployed making it possible for only one duck at a time to pass through the trap and cross the “finish line”. The person’s name that appears on the adoption certificate corresponding to the first duck to cross the finish line will be declared the winner of the “first place” prize. Subsequent prizes will be awarded according to order of finish. A complete list of prizes and winners can be obtained from the Organizer by sending a written request and a self-addressed stamped, return envelope to: Lucky Ducky Derby, c/o The Tennessee Valley Art Association, P.O. Box 474, Tuscumbia, AL, 35674.
5. The Organizer reserves the right, at its sole option, to substitute prizes of comparable value.
6. The staff and board of directors of The Tennessee Valley Art Association and their immediate families shall not be eligible for any prizes covered herein. “Immediate Family” is defined as parents, children, spouses and siblings living in the same household as a staff or board member of The Tennessee Valley Art Association. Parents, children and siblings not living in the same household as a staff or board member of The Tennessee Valley Art Association will be eligible to win prizes covered herein. Winners must sign a “receipt for prize award” certifying eligibility, releasing the Organizer and all sponsors from liability resulting from use of prizes won and permitting the unlimited use of winner’s name and likeness for promotional purposes. The parties hereto agree that The Tennessee Valley Art Association is not liable for any prize obligations to promotion participants who are in violation of this provision.
7. The entry portion of each adoption certificate must be completely filled out and delivered to the Organizer or an authorized representative of the Organizer or mailed to the Organizer at the address set forth in paragraph 4 (four) above and actually received by the Organizer prior to 4:00 p.m., Friday, June 20, 2008 for the certificate to be eligible to win any prize. Ducks will be available for adoption from The Tennessee Valley Art Association and the Muscle Shoals Civitan Club only on June 28 and until Noon on June 29 at the Helen Keller Festival in Spring Park. No other certificates are eligible to win any prize. Entrants assume the risk of non-delivery of entries to the Organizer or an authorized representative of the Organizer.
8. No purchase necessary in order to enter or win. Presenter does request a donation of \$5.00 per adopted duck to benefit The Tennessee Valley Art Association or other participating organizations, all charitable organizations under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.
9. Winners will be announced at the race site. Winners will, where necessary, also be notified by United States Postal Service or by telephone. Race winners need not be present to win. If a race winner does not claim his/her prize from the Organizer at the address listed in paragraph 4 (four) within 30 (thirty) days after June 29, 2008 or if a previously announced winner is later determined to be ineligible due to a rules violation, Organizer will select the next place duck from the June 29, 2008 race as the new winner of the prize. All prizes as set forth herein will be awarded.
10. Any and all taxes and similar fees are the sole responsibility of the winner. An IRS Form 1099 will be prepared and sent to every winner of a prize with a value exceeding \$600.00.
11. By entering, entrants release Organizer and its Officers, Directors, staff and other related entities from any and all liability with respect to prizes.
12. By entering, winners consent to the promotional use of their name and likeness and without additional compensation.
13. Chances on winning depend on the total number of qualified entries.
14. This event is subjected to all federal, state and local laws and regulations and is void where prohibited by law.
15. The conduct of the race and the determination of race winners will be audited by a representative of an independent accounting firm. All decisions and interpretations of rules and regulations will be made by the Organizer and its judgment is final.
16. The logo and name of the Lucky Ducky Derby race are registered trademarks of The Tennessee Valley Art Association and no other person or entity is authorized to copy or otherwise use them without the expressed, written consent of The Tennessee Valley Art Association.
17. A copy of these rules and regulations are available Monday through Friday (except holidays) from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. from the Organizer at the address listed in paragraph 4 (four).
18. Prizes have been provided by donors as charitable contributions to the Organizer and in exchange for promotional consideration.
19. All prizes subject to donor restrictions and limitations.
 - * Joel White Interiors consultation services will be available for a winner living within a 25-mile radius of Florence, Muscle Shoals, Sheffield or Tuscumbia, Alabama.
 - * Winner will be responsible for the pick-up of the floral design from Distinctive Designs, Russellville, Alabama. Winner will be responsible for the pick-up of painting supplies at Pittsburgh Paints in Florence or Muscle Shoals, Alabama.
 - * Eldred Wilkerson will provide painting services for a winner living within a 25-mile radius of Florence, Muscle Shoals, Sheffield or Tuscumbia, Alabama. Painting services based on room square footage. Labor costs exceeding \$300.00 will be the responsibility of prize winner.
 - * Towles House of Carpets will deliver and/or install flooring for a winner within their established delivery area. Winner living outside their established delivery area will be responsible for the pick-up and installation of flooring.
 - * Winner will be responsible for the pick-up of lighting from Shoals Lighting in Muscle Shoals, Alabama.
 - * Town and Country Furniture will deliver furniture for a winner living within their established delivery area. Winner living outside their established delivery area will be responsible for the pick-up of the furniture in luka, Mississippi.
20. There is no guarantee that any person will win the million dollar duck contest. Further, the million dollar duck contest is subject to all rules, contracts, provisions, agreements and requirements of Hole In One International which are available at the Tennessee Valley Art Center. The million dollar duck contest may be funded in any way selected by Hole In One International. Only those contestants who clearly and completely filled out official adoption forms that were received by the Tennessee Valley Art Association by established deadlines will be eligible for the million dollar duck contest. The Tennessee Valley Art Association is not responsible for the payment or funding of the million dollar duck contest and the entrant understands and agrees that the Tennessee Valley Art Association is not responsible for the same.
